

Schedule of Events for Webelos Woods participants:

Oct. 6 Friday

Noon – 9pm Registration and Camp Set Up begins

7pm Richmond Astronomical Society Telescope Viewing:

Weather Permitting, in the fields near Registration Building, **These events are for everyone at the Camporee.**

10pm Cracker Barrel / Webelos Leaders Meeting: At Registration Building, **This event is for all Cub and Webelos Leaders, and Boy Scout Leaders.**

7am – 8:45am Last Minute Registration

9am Camp Opening Ceremony:

At Field across from the Registration Building, **This event is for everyone at the Camporee.** After the opening Ceremony you and your Webelos need to be prepared that you will be taking a morning hike to get to where the Stations will be located, and that the boys will need to carry their lunches with them, some water will be available to them, but they should probably bring what they can carry as well. Immediately following the opening ceremony, Webelos will be formed into Patrols and will be joined by their OA Patrol Guide.

9:30am Webelos Orientation and Disembarking to Stations:

Under power lines near the Stations. **This is for the Webelos, the Webelos Adults, and their Leaders only.** They will then take the last leg of their morning hike to the Station area.

Webelos Leaders, Parents, and any other interested adult will stay for their orientation program on the ways and whys of today's Boy Scout program. This will basically be a question and answer period with some equipment demonstrations showing some things your boys need and some things that are just nice to have. After this orientation you will then take the last leg of your morning hike to rejoin with your group of Webelos.

9:45am Stations Begin: **(This is for the Webelos)**

These will be held at Campsite Areas 3, 4, 5, 6, and the Power Lines between them. Webelos Patrols will begin their adventure at the Station we have selected for them. They will then proceed forward to the next numeric order from that Station, after Station 11 they would then begin at Station 1 and continue on. Most Stations will last approximately 25 minutes (exceptions are Fire Building and Cooking Stations) leaving enough time for the boys to take a small break or to get to their next Station Area.

Lunch will be approximately at 12:45pm and last for approximately 45 minutes; boys will eat in the power line area. This will also be a brief rest period. There will be water available in this area. There is also a latrine near the entrance to Site 4.

7:45pm Campfire Program Begins: At Field across from the Registration Building, **This event is for everyone at the Camporee**

9:30 Departure: Clean up your camp site area – Leave no trace of your visit.

Do not leave any garbage behind, and remove everything you brought. You may pack up and leave as soon as you would like, or spend a leisurely quiet afternoon there.

Webelos Woods Leaders Guide for Saturday Events

Be prepared:

Safety and well being of the boys is our primary concern.

Scout Spirit should be shown at all times. Remember the boys must always use the buddy system. Respect property and clean up after yourself and Patrol.

Dress for the weather of the day, have additional warm clothes and ponchos in case of any weather changes. We will continue in most any weather conditions, unless safety for the boys becomes a factor.

There is a hike involved, in the morning to get to your location, and in the afternoon, to return to your car or campsite. Do not let boy's overload packs with unnecessary items, absolutely no electronic games, radios, walkman, MP3's, or Cell Phones. Make sure your boys are wearing the proper footwear.

Bring your lunch, drinks, drinking water, and any snacks you will need to get you through the day. Once you are at the Station Area, you will not leave the area until your return in the afternoon.

Adults and Leaders you may want to carry a small camp chair or stool with you. The boys do not need to bring one and should not bring one. Wagons would be allowed to help carry lunch etc., remember it is a rocky road you will be traversing.

Since you will be arriving back in your camp later in the afternoon, time will be at a premium for your dinner concerns, keep that in mind in what you may wish to prepare that evening, or if you have others who can begin the preparation before your return.

25 Minutes at most stations, (exceptions are Fire Building and Cooking Stations) follow Station Master's directions

Wait for Station Master to invite you into Station, be considerate of Patrols in front of or behind you, waiting their turns, or doing their activity.

There will be adult Boy Scout Leaders at every station; any issues should be brought to their attention, not to the Boy Scouts running the Station.

In the case of any emergency situation the Boy Scout Leaders are the first you should contact. Problems of any sort should be reported immediately to Sean Higgins, and, or Ralph Orr. **Any injuries, no matter how minor should be reported to us immediately, and on your return at the Registration building.** You must be on our registration list to be covered for any insurance purposes.

There may need to be an exception because of medical or health reasons that some Leaders or boys may not be able to take the complete hike that we are asking them to do. The preferred method of handling this would be to have you drive from the opening ceremony out through the marked exit road. (Traffic in Camp is one way only) You would exit Albrights on the back side and need to drive around to the front main entrance to return into Albrights, and you would park in the parking area across from the lower pavilion. All though there is also a road running up to where the stations are, we can not allow any traffic on that road while the boys are entering or returning from that area.

Remember, 25 Minutes at most stations, follow Station Master's directions!

Lunch is approximately at 12:45pm. If you start at Station 5 through 8, your lunch period may start a little later, and you will still need to begin stations again at 1pm.
